2021 RECAP

After the one of the most successful seasons in program history, the sky's the limit for a team that only graduates three contributors for a team that won the WPIAL title. The Crusaders will once again be in the conversation if not favorites to repeat at Heinz Field in November.

OFFENSE

The Crusaders lose their key contributors in Jaiden Torres and Keshawn Harris, however replacements are ready and willing in XAVIER NELSON and MARQUIS CARTER. The biggest question will come under center as the Crusaders return regular season starter JASON CROSS JR. and postseason starter KOLE OLSZEWSKI who shined in the WPIAL semi and title game. The trenches are deep, and duo NICO MARGITTAI and JAIDEN COLLINS may be the best in 1A. LESAE LACKS is a human highlight reel and possibly the best playmaker on offense.

DEFENSE

Defensively, the Crusaders return nearly everyone. The losses of Willie Banks and Eli Wilson will hurt, however the experience coming back in the trenches may be the best in the classification. BRADEN TRAVIS will be a name to watch as the leader at the LB position. The cupboards are full as well in the secondary as many will play both ways.



OVERVIEW

The Crusaders are not only WPIAL title contenders but possibly favorites to win the whole thing. A surprise upset from District 9 upstarts Redbank Valley kept the Crusaders from Hershey a year ago. A neutral site matchup with Steel High, a year removed from winning the state at 1A themselves, will be a big litmus test for the program. Cornell, Chartiers, and OLSH in 3 of the last 4 down the stretch will also be big tests. If Bishop Canevin comes back with the same talent and buy in as a program, there won't be another team in the WPIAL at 1A that will be able to match their skill and size. Having both the WPIAL champ and WPIAL runner up in the same conference will be a treat and the story of the season at 1A.

2021 RECAP


The OLSH Chargers suffered a heartbreaking road loss at the tail end of the season to Northgate which hurt their playoff seeding, but it ultimately didn't matter, as the Chargers went on a historic November run, upsetting 1 seed Clairton and earning a bid to the WPIAL Final. Now with coach Dan Bradley exiting for Ellwood City, the Chargers return with a lineup fit for another deep season.

OFFENSE

NEHEMIAH AZEEM is one of the top QBs in 1A in the entire region, and it will help that nearly all of his top targets return like ZIGGY MCINTOSH and DORRIEN TATE. DIOR DEVERS in the backfield will also be a lethal weapon for the new coach. The line is deep with returners as well, despite the loss of all-WPIAL Gavin Tonery. Expect to hear the name RYAN FARRELL much more down the stretch.

DEFENSE

The Chargers return a fair amount of starters from a year ago, a team that struggled in the middle portion of the season on defense but locked down in the playoffs. OLSH will have to rely a lot on junior and sophomore depth especially at the second level. If everything translates on defense, OLSH could put themselves in the conversation for another WPIAL title.



OVERVIEW

Watch out for the Chargers offense to take a massive step forward in 2022 under a new look from Donnie Militzer. That step could take OLSH from WPIAL title contenders to state contenders. They'll have to survive a gauntlet of a conference first, something that the Chargers struggled with in 2021. The out-of-conference schedule will help OLSH down the road, opening up with three strong playoff teams before conference play. A playoff rematch against Clairton in early September will be appointment viewing for any lover of WPIAL football. The Chargers will also look to make a statement against a Rochester team that beat them handily. Even if OLSH drops a few close games in the regular season like they did in 2021, OLSH will still be a dangerous team to watch out for in the playoffs.

2021 RECAP

The Raiders rode a talented QB and a deep stable of running backs along with a dominating defense to a WPIAL semifinals berth before being knocked out in a close one to eventual champion Bishop Canevin. Now in a new conference, the Raiders are the wild card to contend for a conference title.

OFFENSE

The Raiders lose QB Sincere Kimbrough and RB Timmy Henderson, both of which controlled the offense in 2021. Along with EJ DAWSON, RAEQUAN TROUTMAN will be the two names to watch for on offense to take the bulk of the carries. Junior JULIAN CORDICE should also filter in and out on offense. The biggest questions will be if the Raiders will have enough line depth to sustain the same offensive dominance that they showed in 2021.

DEFENSE

The Raiders will feel the losses of Shamar Wilson, Carmine Delassandro and Craig Pullford on defense. EJ DAWSON JR is back to lead a senior heavy LB corps. ERIC DENNIS and CAGNEY SMITH will also be key pass rushers for a defense that dominated a year ago. The secondary should be deep as well, meaning that Cornell will be a difficult team to score on once again next season.



OVFRVIFW

Cornell may be the biggest question mark in the entire conference. If the defense is as good or possibly even better than a season ago, the Raiders could be WPIAL title contenders again. If everything goes right, and the offense continues their ground and pound dominance, Cornell could upstage Bishop Canevin for a conference title. Aside from a home matchup with Union Area that could be a close game. The Raiders should be able to overpower each of their opponents before visiting Dormont Stadium on October 7th for an inside track to a conference title. Fort Cherry the week after could be a possible trap game. If Cornell wins more of or half of that stretch of games, the Raiders will be a very dangerous team entering the playoffs once again.

2021 RECAP

The Bucs took a giant leap forward in 2021, capturing second place in the 2A Century and toppling rival McGuffey in a program defining victory. The Bucs bread and butter linebackers all graduate, but they bring back enough depth to make 2022 a promising season in a lower classification.

OFFENSE

The Bucs lose almost everyone from a talented stable of running backs from a year ago. Camden and Cavallo will be difficult to replace. Fortunately for Houston, TERRY FETSKO is back at QB along with top receiving target JAKE MELE. The biggest news for the Bucs is that they bring back a deep line, that although they lose three starters from, all got a wealth of experience in 2021. That experience will be vital for whoever the starting runner will be.

DEFENSE

Much like on offense, on defense the Bucs bring back a couple talented pass rushers in DERRIAN SAULS and JACK HEISER. The biggest absences will be felt at the second level, as Tayvian Miller and Lane Camden both graduated. The Bucs prided themselves on an elite defense in 2021, and if suitable replacements are found at that spot, they should continue the defensive dominance.



OVERVIEW

The Bucs drop back down into 1A in 2022, but don't go back to the Tri-County South. Instead the Bucs will have to deal with 1A championship contenders OLSH and Bishop Canevin along with Cornell who made it to the semifinals. The drop down might have made the schedule more difficult for the Bucs. That being said, if the defense performs to expectations, and the offense finds a couple more playmakers on the roster, Chartiers Houston should be in the conversation to win the conference. The Bucs also have the benefit of having home matchups against two of the three teams in the conversation for a conference title. Chartiers Houston also has a good chance to start the season like they did last year, with several very winnable games before October.

2021 RECAP

Fort Cherry shocked the region in 2020 with a massive upset win over Rochester to put the struggling program on the right track. In 2021, they took an ever bigger step, nearly making the playoffs and only missing out due to Gardner Points.

OFFENSE

The Rangers lose their best two players from over the past few seasons in Maddox Truschel and his primary receiving target Anthony Dalessandro. Both runners return in NATHAN HEIRENDT and ETHAN FALETTO and will be relied upon especially early in the year, when the new QB and most of the wideouts are still being worked in. MATT SIEG will be the guy who gets the first look under center for the Rangers. LOUIS RYAN, DOMINIC SALVINI, and a healthy roster of underclassmen bolster the line and should be a positive throughout the year.

DEFENSE

RYAN and SALVINI are back to lock down the interior defensive line, however the Rangers lose their all-conference ends in Weyers and Cook. Look for IAN MAWINNEY, ANTHONY SALVINI, or JACOB BROOKS to fill in those roles. The secondary has the chance to be loaded as well, with ZACH SERAFIN back to team up with a few two-way guys. In the end, this defense will likely retain the same continuity that they developed a year ago.



OVERVIEW

Despite the losses, Fort Cherry has the chance to be a wholesale better team than they were a year ago. Unfortunately for the Rangers, the road gets much tougher. In-Conference wins against Northgate, Union, and Shenango a year ago, are now guaranteed losses against Cornell, Bishop Canevin and Chartiers Houston. If the Rangers have any aspirations of sneaking into the playoffs, they'll have to steal one or two of those games. An early home matchup and return to a rivalry against Chartiers Houston could be Fort Cherry's best opportunity. The Rangers will have the defense to stay in games in 2022 like they did a year ago, but for them to take the biggest step forward, the offense will need to produce at a much higher clip. The more experienced run heavier offense could help with that

2021 RECAP

The Cougars will look forward to the drop down to 1A after several middling seasons at the 2A level. The Big Seven will be just as difficult for a rebuilding Cougars team. Carlynton's only victory in 2021 came against Brentwood in a defensive battle. Expect plenty of improvement against a weaker schedule with a team that brings back almost everyone.

OFFENSE

JAYDIN MCKNIGHT is already getting attention from division 1 schools and he's only entering his junior season. He'll be the big standout for the Cougars offense. His primary pass thrower is back as well with DEVONTE DEAN. DEAN is only a sophomore so expect the passing game to develop throughout the year. The Cougars will need to find someone to fill in in the backfield. The line will have to replace two stalwarts, which might prove difficult.

DEFENSE

The Cougars had a defense in 2021 that was able to keep them in some games. With nearly everyone back, expect that to continue. Junior LBs NATE GIBSON and JACOB STIFFLER are both back as the strong point in the Cougars defense. There will be plenty of two way guys in the secondary that will make that unit strong as well.



OVERVIEW

Carlynton is the team with the most possible fluctuation in terms of record for the 2022 season. It isn't outside of the realm of possibility the Cougars could be competing for a conference title with the talent they have. McKNIGHT will keep the Cougars competitive in games with better teams. Carlynton should have healthy challenges in the out of conference before taking on the gauntlet. Carlynton will have to travel to every team that they will have to beat to be the best of the rest, Ft. Cherry, Burgettstown, Avella. The good news is that they'll play host to every conference favorite aside from Cornell, the Cougars could easily play the spoiler in any of those games. With such a young team still, the Cougars could be looking at a team built for a deep run in 2023

SCHROCKMAN, CHARLES and RUSSELL will all also provide excellent targets. The real experience comes up front and should keep the Blue Devils on the scoreboard more than they were in 2021.

DEFENSE

The Blue Devils biggest strong point in 2021 was on defense, giving up 14 points or less in the final three weeks of the season to secure a playoff spot. BRODIE KUZIOR and BRIAN CHARLES should help fill in the roles of AJ Kuzior and Jaeron Cody whose strong LB play was the calling card for the Blue Devils a year ago. There's also depth up front which will help Burgettstown separate from some of the weaker teams in the Big Seven.



OVERVIEW

The Blue Devils could be very one dimensional in 2022, which means that they probably won't be in the conversation for a conference title in 2022. The run heavy offense will be a big help in a much tougher conference than a year ago. If the Defense performs like they did down the stretch in 2021, they'll be competitive in most of the games throughout the season. There's still a good chance the Blue Devils compete for the playoffs in 2022, and that will come down to the final three weeks of the year. If Burgettstown can sweep Carlynton, Avella, and Fort Cherry and steal a game from Cornell, OLSH or Chartiers Houston, the Blue Devils will be playoff bound. More likely than not, however, the Blue Devils could be 5th and the last team without a dance partner when the Dog and Pony show starts.

The gauntlet of the brand new Big Seven won't be kind to the Eagles in 2022, however if Ryan Cecchini can find young talent that shows promise against Fort Cherry or Burgettstown in the back half of the season, Avella could be looking up in 2023.
